Commissioner's Report

- TOPS - See Report
 - Water Cities hosted a TOPS session that ran for five weeks with 20 players participating.

- Scheduling - See Report
 - The Classic and Recreational Schedule will be published by end of March.
 - Deadlines for the registration process are listed on the Scheduling Report at the end of the minutes.
 - Once the schedule has been processed clubs have an opportunity to make changes to the schedule before it is activated. Clubs can make field and time changes at will. If a date change is requested the two clubs must discuss the new dates and come to an agreement before a change is made.
 - The final date to contact a club to make a schedule change is March 27, 2018.
 - Once the schedule is live, it was decided that the rescheduling tool would no longer be used to request schedule changes. Coaches will need to contact each other to work out a new date for a rescheduled game. It is the home team's responsibility to make sure the referees, fields and game schedule are updated. Coaches should be considerate and put the main information at the top of an email. Schedule Managers should not have to shift through several emails to determine what the new game date, time and field will be.
 - A reminder to all clubs that East Central has a 48-hour cancelation policy for referees that are scheduled for a game. If the game has not been canceled 48-hours before game time, the offending club will be asked to pay the total referee fees.
 - If a coach is having trouble in reaching a coach from another club, they should contact the club president, DOC or administrator.

Motion: A motion was made by Bruce Pecore (United Hurricanes) and seconded by Wayne Stoflet (KASA) to stop using the rescheduling tool for East Central Schedule changes.

After compiling a list of teams competing in East Central Leagues (including level of play) Sue Ann will distribute the team groupings back to club DOC's/ registrars for their review allowing additional changes to divisional play. A new compilation will be sent out prior to the pre-scheduling meeting on March 7.

Adult Teams & Academy Schedules will be generated at a later date.

The annual pre-scheduling meeting is set for **Wednesday, March 7, 6:30 PM Kimberly High School LGI Room**. On Thursday, March 8 Scheduling will begin. The first draft of the schedule is expected to be ready for club editing on Saturday, March 10, 2018.

All Team "Staff Members" must have a current working e-mail address & phone number (Cell?).

When necessary, game scheduler will move games to alternate play date to fit schedule into predetermined time frame.

Coach Compliance Policy – Cost per Module is \$70.00

A team must be coached by an individual who is appropriately licensed for the age group and competition level being coached. If the coach is not appropriately licensed, that individual is not eligible to coach the team during sanctioned matches. All coaches, head and assistant, must be properly licensed. The following are the minimum license requirements per age and competition level:

- Recreational coaches are required to have, at minimum, completed 1 In-Person Grassroots Module OR a Y1 or Y2 coaching certificate.



- Coaches working with Youth Academy teams are required to have completed a combination of 2 In-Person Grassroots modules, recommended 4v4, 7v7 OR hold a US Soccer 'E' License.
- Coaches of 11U through 18U Classic teams are required to have completed 2 In-Person Grassroots Modules, one must be 9v9 or 11v11 OR hold a US Soccer 'E' License.
- Coaches working with 12U – 14U Competitive and State League teams are required to have completed 2 In-Person Grassroots Modules, one must be 9v9 or 11v11 OR hold a US Soccer 'E' License.
- Coaches of 15U and older State League teams are required to have the US Soccer 'D' License.
- Coaches working with WDA teams are required to have the US Soccer 'D' License.
- Coaches working with MRL teams are subject to the license requirements established by the MRL*. WYSA will verify team and coach eligibility based on the Regional requirement.

- Coaches working with WDA teams are required to have the US Soccer 'D' License.

EIGHT NEW GRASSROOTS LICENSING COURSES WILL FOCUS ON COACHING FUNDAMENTALS WITH RESPECT TO U.S. SOCCER'S PLAYER DEVELOPMENT INITIATIVES

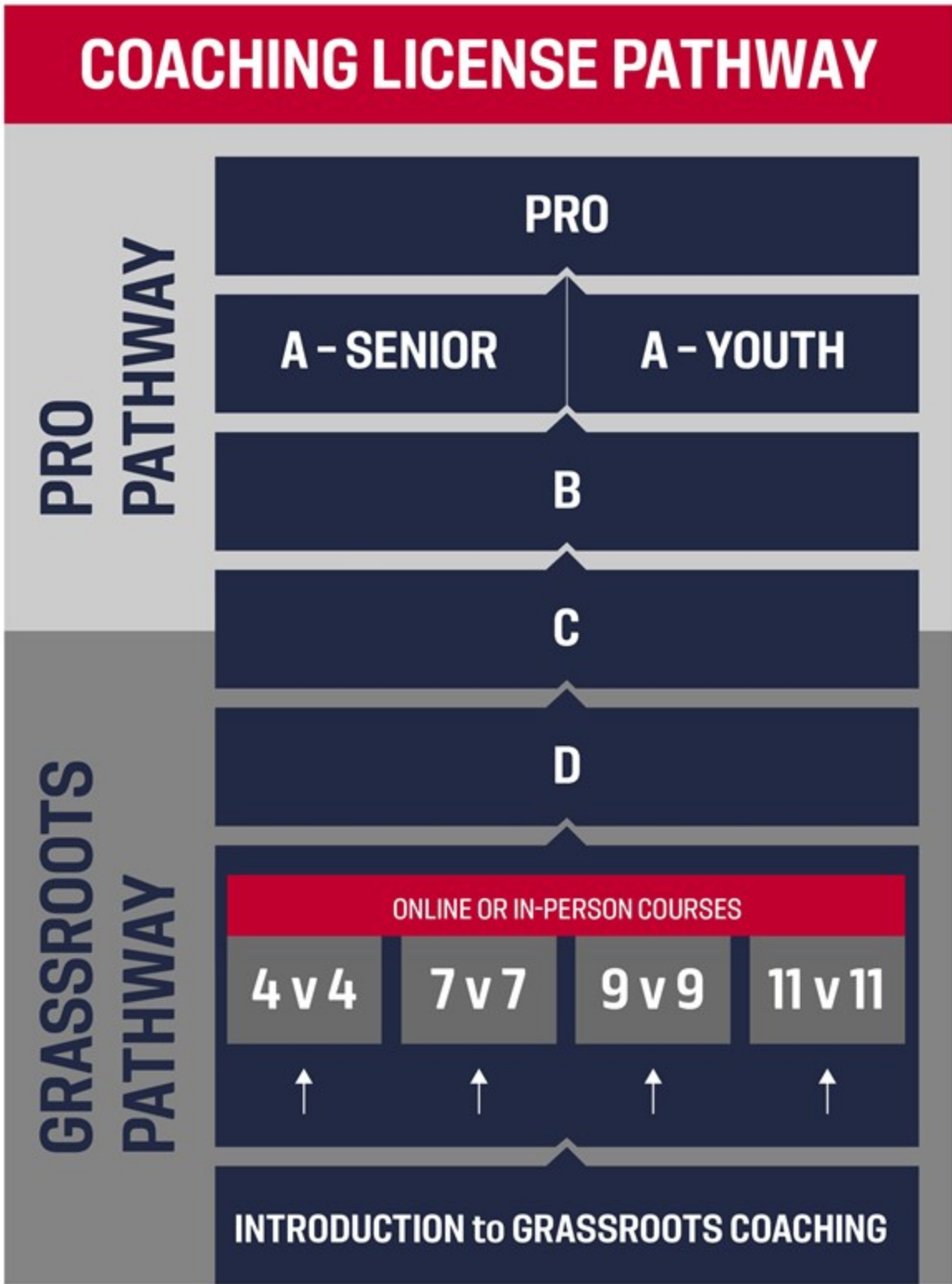
CHICAGO (Dec. 20, 2017) – U.S. Soccer has announced eight (8) new grassroots level coaching courses to be introduced in early 2018. These courses will be focused on empowering coaches through experiential learning and a player-centered approach. The course options will relate directly to small-sided games and the respective age-groups outlined in the [Player Development Initiatives](#).

The new Grassroots Licensing Courses will consist of four (4) in-person experiences and four (4) online experiences. Prospective coaches will have the option to engage in any of these new courses – in any sequence – after completing a free introductory module provided by U.S. Soccer.

“This new, a-la-carte approach is meant to empower grassroots coaches to access education – relevant to their needs and specific coaching environment – immediately through these new low barrier opportunities,” said Frank Tschan, Director of Coaching Administration.

In addition to the eight (8) new opportunities, the D course has also been updated in accordance with the revamped approach at the grassroots level. “Over the last 12-months, U.S. Soccer has worked with its members to organize, study and pilot these new opportunities. This has been an immense project initiated by the Federation and its importance cannot be understated. The game is founded at the grassroots level; these courses will help ensure fun, enjoyable and developmentally appropriate environments.”

Concurrently with the roll out of the new courses, the current F and E courses will transition out of the U.S. Soccer Coaching Pathway. These licenses will still be recognized by U.S. Soccer and both certifications remain relevant as a means to advance within the pathway. As demonstrated in the past, member organizations will be empowered to organize and host the in-person grassroots courses and the updated D course on behalf of U.S. Soccer. More specific information on the newly formatted grassroots courses, including format and scheduling, will be released in early 2018.



“To continue to improve the state of soccer in the United States, we must continue to improve the players in our country. This begins with our coaches and there is not a larger or more impactful group than our coaches at the grassroots level,” said Director of Coaching Education, Nico Romeijn. “These new introductory courses will provide a supportive approach to teaching and coaching players at 4v4, 7v7, 9v9 and 11v11. Whether you are the unfamiliar parent volunteer, the transitioning player or a veteran coach, you should be able to walk away from these courses with more knowledge and a better understanding of how to effectively develop your players.”
